

Announcement of the Appointment of Executive Vice President of UB Friday 18th March 2022 Chair, UB Board of Trustees Allyson Maynard-Gibson QC Remarks

Good morning.

Ever since its inception as the College of The Bahamas, University of The Bahamas has been envisioned as an institution that would enable the fullest potential of the Bahamian people to be realized.
